YOUR GUIDE TO SAFE DISPOSAL OF TV'S AND ELECTRONICS IN CALUMET COUNTY

Calumet County residents can utilize these recycling options to safely and legally dispose of used televisions, computers, and other electronics:

American TV—all American TV stores; will accept most electronics free. Limit: 2 e-cycled products per day per household. <u>www.americantv.com/pages/e-cycle.jsp</u>

Best Buy—all Best Buy stores; will accept TV's (32" or smaller), desktop computers & notebooks (remove hard drive), VCR, DVD players and phones. <u>\$10 charge/each for monitor or screen</u>; a \$10 Best Buy gift card is issued for each item. Go to www.bestbuy.com and search for "recycling."

- Private citizens are required by state law to recycle electronics as of Sept. 1, 2010. In addition to being the law, recycling these items helps preserve natural resources and keep the environment clean.
- Wisconsin law requires businesses and institutions to recycle discarded electronics or handle them as a hazardous waste.
- Televisions and other electronics contain valuable, reusable materials. Plastics, glass, scrap metal (including copper and gold), and many other materials can be extracted from old TVs and used to make new products.
- Televisions contain harmful materials, including lead, chromium, mercury, and polybrominated flame retardants. If landfilled or incinerated, these chemicals can be released into groundwater, surface water, or the air where they pose a risk to human and environmental health.
